

## Citizen's Police Academy

The Middlefield Police Department is organizing a Citizen's Police Academy. The nine- or 10-week course will be held at the police station and/or one of the schools one evening each week. Qualifying residents/students will study topics such as the criminal process; traffic stops; investigations; use of force; patrol responsibilities; domestic violence; theft; disorderly conduct and more.

"Offering this kind of training to Middlefield Village residents will enhance communication and understanding between the community and police, as well as inform residents of many aspects of police policies and procedures," says Officer Brandon Gray, recently appointed by Chief Arnold E. Stanko to spearhead the project.

"We should have it up and running by January" Gray adds.

The local police force expects that graduates from this academy will then be trained and willing to volunteer to help with Village programs and activities and be available when safety issues arise. ## Land Dedication for New Church Building

On Sunday, Oct. 27, the congregation of the First United Methodist Church in Middlefield and several community officials and residents dedicated 15 acres of land at 14715 Old State Road, Middlefield.

This land will be the site for a new church. The cross led the way as the congregation processed from the current building through the center of Middlefield to the

new site. The cross was placed in the soil and the ground was consecrated. The church will be built within walking distance for students in the local schools and adjacent to Mary Yoder's Restaurant. In 2009, the congregation felt a nudge that God was calling it to do something but recognized that the present facility limited expanding current and initiating new ministries. Building an addition to

the current building was not possible, so the search for a new location began. Construction on the building is not yet scheduled. In the meantime, the land will serve as the site for new ministries. Current possibilities are an off-site worship service, a community garden, and recreation fields. Rev. Ed Peterson is in his ninth year as pastor of First United Methodist Church. 🌿



## Sperry Lane Roadwork Nears Completion

In late March 2013, work began on a massive undertaking to improve Sperry Lane in Middlefield Village. To date, an 8-inch water line, 12-inch and 15-inch storm sewer and catch basins, 8-inch sanitary sewer and manholes, new sidewalks and drive aprons, and curb drains have been installed, along with all new connections to houses (water and sewer).

Yet to be completed is to bring manholes to grade level and fill topsoil in crosswalk stop bars. Workers will also be installing sidewalks to the Boy Scout Lodge and walk path at Mineral Lake for all to enjoy.

Charlie Ehrhart, streets and utilities director for the Village of Middlefield, greatly appreciates the patience of local residents. "People on Sperry Lane put up with a lot but were always pleasant to work with, as was The Fortuna Construction company" says Ehrhart. "To me, this was a street of all seasons – beginning with the last snowflakes of spring, through the hot days of summer, and colorful foliage of fall with the first snowfall already occurring. I enjoyed the entire project." 🌿
